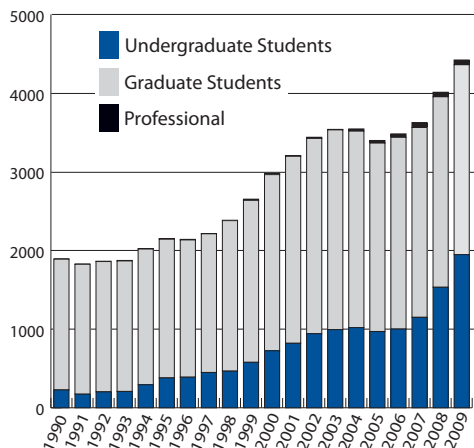

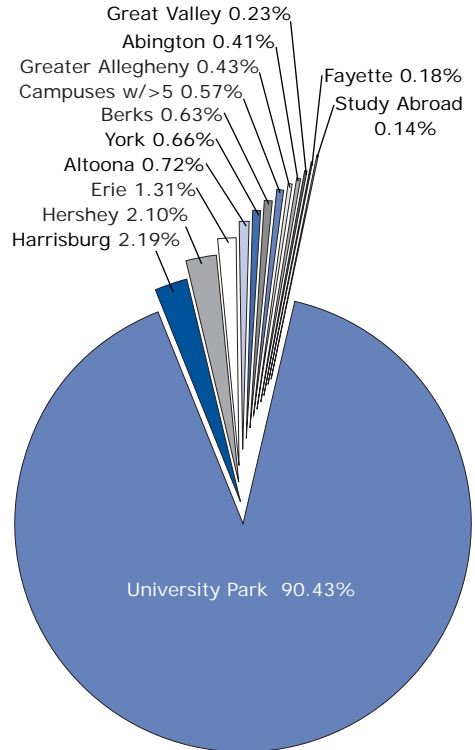

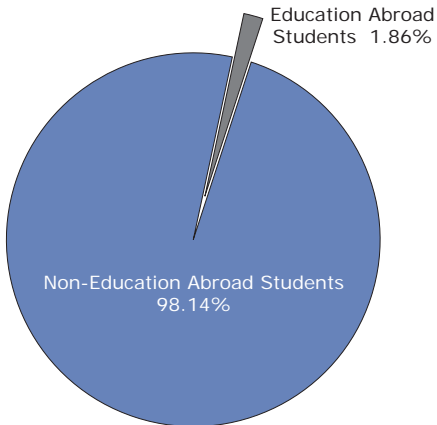

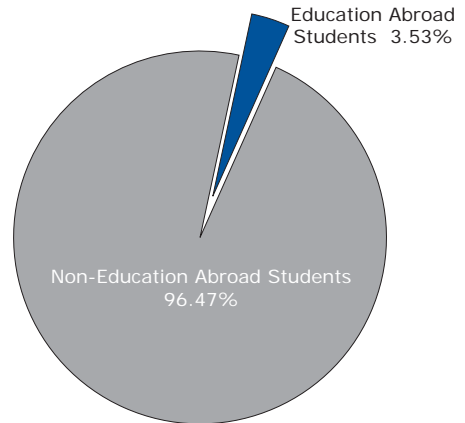
EA Students vs. Non-EA Students University-Wide, Fall 2009

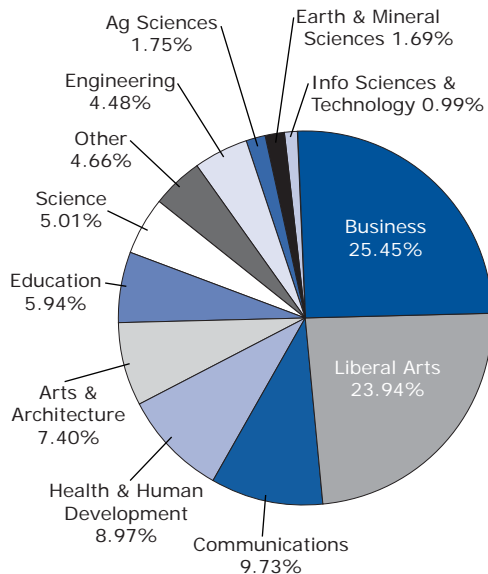

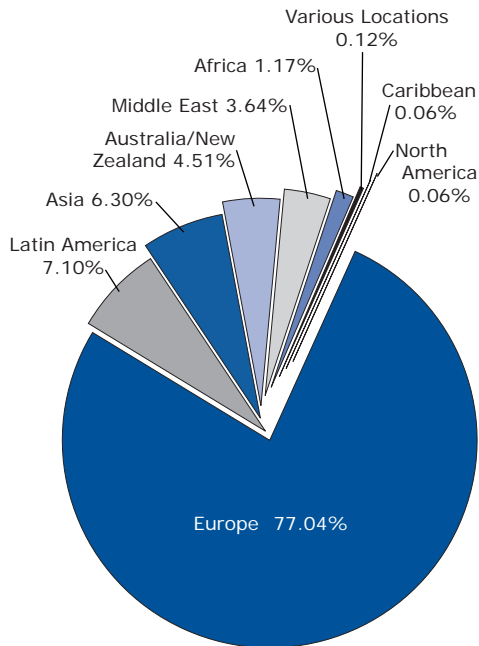

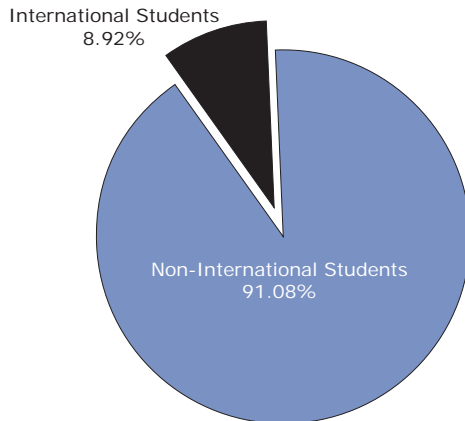
International Students vs. Non-International Students University-Wide, Fall 2009

International Students vs. Non-International Students at University Park, Fall 2009

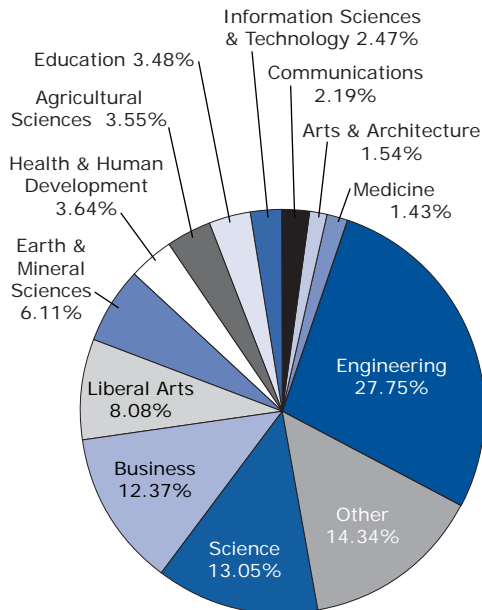

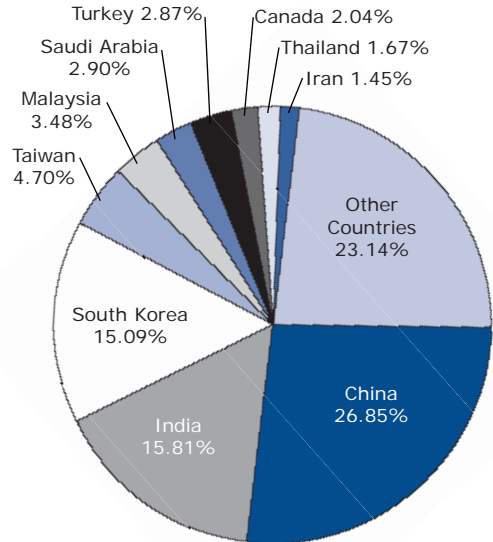

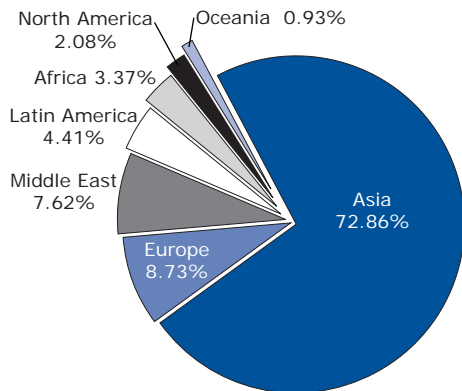
